Bernard Weatherill House is the first stage of a regeneration programme developed through a partnership between Croydon Council and John Laing.

Located adjacent to the Grade II Listed Victorian Town Hall, the development provides modern commercial accommodation over 13 storeys combined with a new ground floor public access facility in the heart of the building. The scheme includes a dedicated conference centre, health suite, meeting room suite, union facilities, staff canteen and external amenity spaces.

The development is a 240,000sqft office building (awarded BREEAM "Excellent") designed to house Croydon Council and a range of local service providers.

TROX UK designed and manufactured top discharge beams and DID600 MSCB for the project which incorporated luminaires and PIR sensors.
